

PopIT Pages - Parameter Table

These are the parameters you can use in your **PopIT Refs** when creating a **PopIT Page LinX**.

The only required parameter is # + the section ID

All PopIT LinX **MUST START** with [[and **END** with]]

All parameters **MUST** be separated by a colon ':'

eg: [[#23:txt=click here:title=Click here for more details]]

P	Description	Example Usage
#	This is the first character and it must always be followed by a number. The number must be a valid page section ID which then opens that section in a PopIT Window .	#23
txt	The text you want to use for the link (default is Page Title) You can use any text you like as the link.	txt=Click here
title	The mouseover text (default is 'Click to view') Enter the text you want to display when the mouse is held over the link. This works with all types of LinX.	title=Click here for more details
width	The width of the PopIT Window (default is 700 pixels) Use this if you only have a short section of text to display.	width=400
link	The type of link - text or button (default is text) Use this if you want to display the link as a button instead of plain text.	link=button
button	The background colour of the button (default is orange) Only use this if you have also set link=button and you want a different colour button background.	button=yellow
thumb	Thumbnail image used as a link (default is text) Use this if you want an image from your Media folder as the link. You can use any graphic or photo as the link. Note: enter the full path to your image if it is not in the root of your Media folder, eg: thumb=buttons/showinfo.jpg	thumb=mybutton.jpg
align	Alignment of thumbnail (default is no alignment) Use this if you want your thumbnail to align left or right in relation to any text around it. Note: you can insert your LinX in table cells for more precise alignment.	align=left
imgborder	The thumbnail border colour (default is no border) Only use this if you want a border around your thumbnail image.	imgborder=black
margin	The thumbnail margin space (default is 15 pixel) Only use this if you want a larger margin around your thumbnail image.	margin=30
